Finished size for this month's component is 72.5" x 12.5"

This month's challenge takes the somewhat random streamers set in a background color to make a banner across the top of our quilt. The finished panel is not as tall as the quilt. Whether you build the strips as instructed in the pattern and sub-cut into two 12.5" strips or use the patter and sketch an idea and improv the individual strips, you will construct 2 solid background strips with 34 streamer strips between.

For our 2025 Block of the Month Challenge, we will be making selected parts of quilts featured by the Modern Quilt Guild. Each month's instructions will include the featured quilt, the component that needs to be made, modifications for the BOM, and any setting strips needed, and the finished piece size. We have decided for simplicity we will be providing you with the pattern from MQG. Members will end the year with an amazing quilt and for some new skills.

A QUILT PATTERN BY FINISHED SIZE 36 X 36



SUPPLIES

5 Fat Quarters for the Streamers

1 Solid Jelly Roll or 1 yd. Solid for the Background


1 1/2 yd. for the Backing


3/4 yd. solid for the Binding (we used 5 Jelly Roll Strips)

Matching Thread for Piecing and Quilting

CUT

All strips, including the background are 2 1/2" wide. From the streamer fat quarters, cut the following (left to right):





From the background color, cut (32) 2 1/2" x 20" strips. From the background color, but (2) 2 1/2" x 36" strips.



SEW

- 1. Sew (2) background strips to (1) streamer strip.
- 2. Press the seams open.
- 3. Sew rows A-H together, pressing towards the background color.
- 4. Sew rows I-P together, pressing towards the background color.
- 5. Sew the two sections together, pressing either direction.
- 6. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 36" background strip to each side.
- 7. Trim quilt top to desired length (we chose 36" to match the width).

HELP MEI

Use 1/4" seam allowance.

When sewing the strips together, switch directions on every other one. Slightly offset the rows for the organic look on the top of the streamers.

QUILT


Layer the batting and backing to the quilt top.

Baste and machine quilt as desired.

Bind as desired.
